You have submitted your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) indicating you are unaccompanied homeless youth or unaccompanied, self-supporting at risk of being homeless youth but do not have any of the following documentation below:

- High school or school district homeless liaison determination that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or were self-supporting and at risk of being homeless.
- Director of an emergency shelter or transitional housing program funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development determination that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or were self-supporting and at risk of being homeless.
- Director of a runaway or homeless youth basic center or transitional living program determination that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or were self-supporting and at risk of being homeless.

Instructions:

If you have documentation for any of the above situations, please submit that documentation to the Financial Aid Office. If you do not have documentation for any of the above situations, please continue below. To be determined by the Financial Aid Office as meeting the criteria for unaccompanied homeless youth or unaccompanied, self-supporting at risk of being homeless youth for the aid year, you must meet a combination or all the following definitions below.

Homeless Youth Definitions:

- At risk of being homeless – when a student’s housing may cease to be fixed, regular, and adequate, for example, a student who is being evicted and has been unable to find fixed, regular, and adequate housing.
- Homeless – lacking fixed, regular, and adequate housing
- Self-Supporting – when a student pays for their own living expenses, including fixed, regular, and adequate housing
- Unaccompanied – when a student is not living in the physical custody of a parent or guardian

Housing:

- Fixed – stationary, permanent and not subject to change
- Regular – used on a predictable, routine, or consistent basis
- Adequate – sufficient for meeting both the physical and psychological needs typically met in the home

Please submit to the Financial Aid Office:

1. In your own words, a signed and dated statement explaining how you fit any or all these definitions.
2. At least one piece of third-party documentation (signed and dated letter from anyone that also understands your circumstances, rental agreements, doctor's notes, etc.) to support your claim. You may submit more than one piece of third-party documentation, but at least one must be submitted.

Once we receive your statement, we may request a follow-up interview with you to determine if you meet any of these criteria.
